1. Renewal of NI-course for G-COE program

Design of one of the G-COE education courses, *Nano Material Initiative* course (NI-course), has been discussed and settled for the opening in 2008 spring semester. Some revisions have been added to this course founded on the basis of that had been operated in 21st Century COE, in which 00 students completed the course curriculum for the past 4 years.
